This perspective is alive and well within our Hutchinson community, positively impacting our children and our adult community members with developmental disabilities. Our "family" includes not only parents and siblings, but also a wide variety of individuals, friends and businesses who have shown their desire to be inclusive, to walk through life together, and to share in everyday experiences...together.

My personal experiences as a parent, friend, educator and athletic coach have shaped my perspective and fueled my desire to support and provide for our families and their children with disabilities. I am passionate about my Christian faith, music, being active in a variety of sports, traveling, and spending time with my husband, Kurt, our 4 adult children and families, and our awesome English Bulldog, Elvis (who can be found most days at the club, lovingly caring for and snuggling with members, greeting visitors, or snoozing!)
